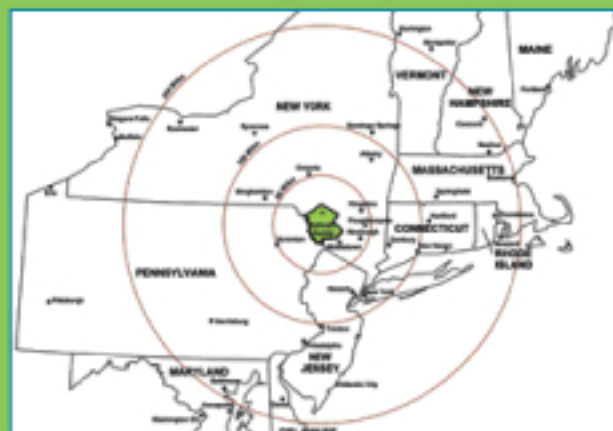

DUKE POTTERY

Carolyn Duke

855 County Route 93, Roscoe, NY 12776

Nestled on a mountaintop with views deep into the Delaware River Valley, the natural beauty surrounding Duke Pottery is apparent in the art of Carolyn Duke's hand-built pottery. Carolyn works primarily with pinch pots, looking to the patterns and rhythms in nature for inspiration. She is attracted to simplicity in the form, finding the beauty in a pot captured in a single gesture.

Though simple in form, an amazing amount of energy is captured in every piece. The pinch pot allows her to explore her individual approach to clay resulting in original designs that make very special gifts for the people you love.

Carolyn fires primarily in a raku kiln, but also uses horse-hair, pit firing, and smoking to enhance the natural beauty of her pots. Her functional ware is high fired with richly colored layers of glaze on the interior contrasting a texture exterior of earth tones.

Duke Pottery has a gift shop and art gallery featuring the work of photographer husband, Dana Duke in addition to an ever-increasing number of artists from the area.

Carolyn's passion for clay is contagious. Come and experience one of the best scenic spots in Sullivan County and find the pot that is just right for you. **Visa/MC**

Directions from Roscoe:

Travel Southwest on Stewart Ave. (under RT 17) to stop sign. Right on CR 92. CR 92 turns into CR 93. Travel 6 miles. Duke Pottery on right. **From Hankins:** Route 97 to Hankins. Turn on to CR 94. CR 94 turns into CR 93. Travel 8 miles. Duke Pottery on left. **Friday-Sunday, 11-5 or by appointment**

EARTHGIRL POTTERY

I create my pottery in a hundred year old barn, overlooking a sparkling spring fed pond. It thrills me every time I take a piece of clay and make something new. I find the remarkable fluidity of throwing on the wheel completely absorbing.

My pottery is all functional, but ranges in style from vases with attached handbuilt flowers and crisp apple canisters to sophisticated dinnerware and serving pieces to jack-o-lantern cookie jars that watch you move around your kitchen.

You can see my inspirations in my work: our neighborhood farm animals, folk art holiday decorations and my late grandmother's inexplicable collection of clowns.

My color palate comes directly from my gardens, the chartreuse of spring, deep rich brown of the soil and riot of bright colors that stretch to the skies in the summer sun.

Directions from Jeffersonville:

Take Willy Ave. (RT 127) 5 miles to Callicoon Center (follow the double yellow lines). Make a left at the stop sign onto The Gulf Road. Take the 2nd right, onto Bayer Road, up the hill to #92. The driveway is long and the studio is located in the old barn behind the house. **From Roscoe:** Make a left on the Gulf Road and travel 9 miles thru Callicoon Center turn right on Bayer Road, — continue as above. **Studio is open year round by appointment or chance.**

Come visit this beautiful hill-top pottery and enjoy the glorious views. Here on Honey Hill, you will find inspired claywork by Ayla.

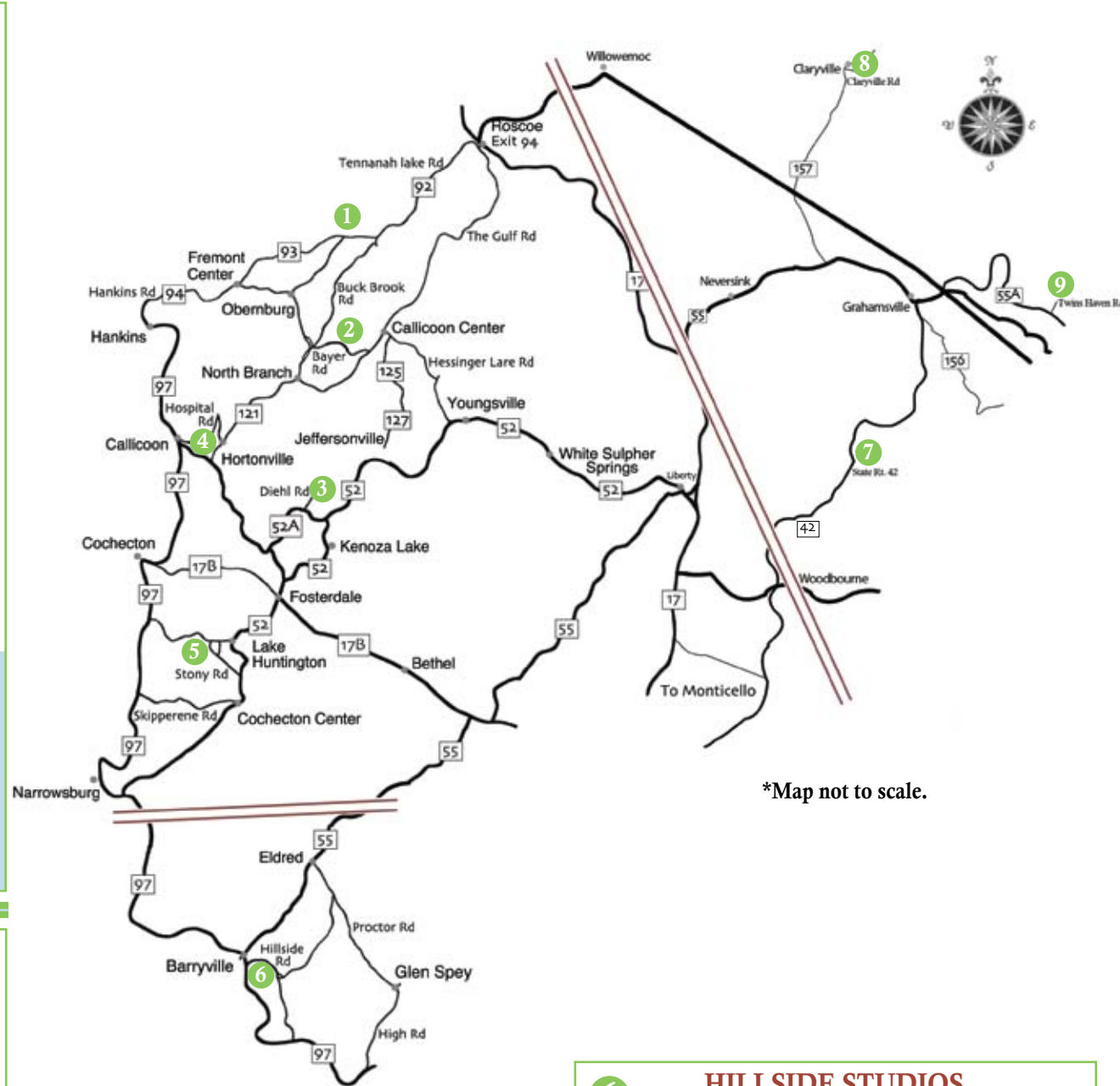
Ayla is a world renowned ceramic artist who loves to design the elegant shapes that she "throws" on the potters wheel. Sometimes altering and adding onto the form, you are sure to find a special design style that speaks to you. Highly collectible and for your endless enjoyment, Ayla's pots are made of durable stoneware and are stunning. Here at Honey Hill you will find: bowls, sets, tumblers and pitchers, oval servers, lighting fixtures, sconces and so much more. Ayla does installations, birdbaths, garden pieces as well as dinnerware, wedding gifts and all manner of custom orders. All pots are signed and limited editions are numbered.

The gallery also features the work of local artists in a variety of media. Ayla's sweetheart, Gary, makes the most delicious maple syrup (available for sale), tapped from the trees right here on Honey Hill.

CECILY FORTESCUE

Cecily Fortescue

English-born ex-university lecturer who became a potter thirty years ago. She specializes in free-form one-of-a-kind handbuilt pieces, some of them very large. Superimposed layers of glazes give her work unusual depth, although the exterior of the large bowls is often left unglazed in order to achieve an organic and sculptural look.

Cecily's studio is located in an old farmhouse, off the beaten track, with a beautiful view. Her work can also be seen at the Catskill Artists Gallery at 38 Main Street in Liberty. When not creating clay masterpieces she can be found playing musical ones on WJFF-Radio Catskill. The host of Afternoon Classics is also a master of the viola and the tennis racket.

Directions from Callicoon:

At the blinking light on RT 97 turn up the hill and then immediately right on Hospital Road. Go 9/10 mile to a red dirt road that angles up the hill to the right and follow it to the end. **Studio is open year round by chance or appointment.**

SUNSHINE POTTERY

Barbara Brown

As a child I was introduced to clay by watching a master Japanese potter throw huge urns on a stand-up kick wheel. He allowed me to touch the spinning clay with wet fingers and a sensation became rooted in my being. My early fascination with classic forms still influences my direction. I work on the potters' wheel throwing classic porcelain urns and vessels.

I vary the theme with a range of colors, textures, functions and sizes. I studied, apprenticed and taught at the Silvermine Guild School of Art in New Canaan, Connecticut. As a result, I learned all the basics of creating pottery from clay and glaze mixing to firing kilns. I have been potting for twenty years.

Today, I own and operate Sunshine Cottage Bed and Breakfast and I am a member of the Catskill Artists' Gallery in Liberty. **Visa/MC/AMEX**

Directions from 17B:

Left to 52 West into Lake Huntington. Right on CR116, left on Rauch Rd., right on Stony-#109 1st house on the right. Studio on the right side of driveway. **From Route 97:** Lake Huntington Road, CR 116, Pass Town Hall, right onto Rauch, Right onto Stony, #109 1st house on the right. Studio is on the right side of driveway. **Studio is open year round by chance or appointment.**

HILLSIDE STUDIOS

Anthony N. Biancovisio

111 Hillside Road, Barryville, NY 12719

Anthony N. Biancovisio specializes in creating distinctive sculptural and functional works of ceramic art that are sensual in form, visually arresting, and highly tactile.

Each piece is wheel-thrown, placed in a small wood burning kiln, then smoke fired to a low temperature — an ancient technique that accentuates the soft, open, and natural qualities of earthenware clay. Pots that are shiny, very smooth, and very pleasurable to touch have been brushed with multiple layers of fine clay slip (Terra Sigillata), and then hand-burnished, a process used by Southwestern Native American potters. The unique abstract designs and interesting color combinations that appear on some pots is created by placing minerals and organic materials around the pieces in the kiln. The earth, water, air and fire determine the stunning unique and unpredictable results.

Studio located on a charming old farm property, one mile from the scenic Delaware River.

Directions from Barryville:

At the blinking light intersection of Route 97 and Route 55 in Barryville, take 97 South. Proceed 3/10 mile, make left hand turn on Hillside Rd. Studio is one mile up hill on left. **Studio is open year round by chance or appointment.**

I have been a professional clay artist since 1970 in NYC where I belonged to a co-op pottery studio in Soho. I taught classes and sold pottery in craft galleries and shops all over the US. My work had a humorous and sculptural quality, which by 1979 allowed my career to naturally evolve into 3-D clay illustration. I spent the next seven years doing caricature magazine illustration, both advertising and editorial. Gradually my career evolved into yet another type of freelance clay work, that of sculpting prototypes and factory-ready models for the toy, gift, and cosmetic industries.

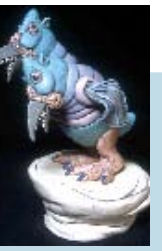
Just a few years ago, the longing to get back to the feel of earth clay and doing my own work got the better of me, and I once again have a pottery studio.

My new work is varied. I work in porcelain, earthenware, and stoneware. I enjoy all 3 traditional handbuilding techniques — pinch, slab and coil. The consistent qualities in my work are: lyricism, whimsy, attention to delicate detail, and pushing clay to its limits. I'm happy to make functional art that people can enjoy using in their everyday lives.

My work is also available at the Catskill Artists Gallery in Liberty.

Directions from RT 42:

My studio is easy to find on Rt. 42, halfway between Woodbourne and Grahamsville, in a scenic area on the eastern side of our county. **Studio is open by chance or appointment.**

CLARYVILLE POTTERY

Newly renovated and re-opened, Claryville Pottery is located at the eastern edge of Sullivan County. In this lovely Catskill setting, Anne-Marie Kremer creates pottery that is both traditional and contemporary. Functional wheel-thrown ware such as bowls, mugs, pitchers, and planters as well as decorative vases, plates and tiles grace her showroom shelves. The pottery features a wide variety of colors and surfaces: soft, luminous ash glazes, warm golds and browns, glossy copper reds and celadons.

Visitors are welcome to visit the studio and see how the pottery is produced as well as browse in the showroom. We are open year round most weekdays and weekends from 10 am on; please call ahead to be certain we are home.

Directions from Liberty:

From Liberty take 55 East (exit100A) approximately 15 miles to Curry. Turn left on County Road 19 towards Claryville and Big Indian. Go 4 miles to Claryville. The pottery is located on the right just past the turn-off to Frost Valley at 982 Claryville Road. Look for the Claryville Pottery sign 150 yards before the pottery. **Studio is open year round.**

My goal is to create beautiful wheel-thrown, functional pottery - bowls, mugs, vases, pitchers, lamps, planters, berry bowls, etc. I make hand-built decorative and sculptural pieces as well. The high-fired clays are glazed in a variety of colors and techniques, using layered tones and textures to create an interesting surface.

You will find hand painted brushwork, botanical motifs, traditional colorful spongeware, faceted forms, Catskill Landscapes and more. I hope my work creates a sense of connection to craftsmanship and to the beauty of nature, and gives joy in using it in your home everyday. **Visa/MC**

Directions:

From blinking light on Rt. 55, go up past Tri-Valley School to Rt. 55A at the Round-out Reservoir. Turn left on 55A and go for 2 miles (look for eagles). Stay on 55A - it turns right at the brick power station - to Lackawack Hill Road. 1/2 mile up Lackawack, go left on Twins Haven Road. Continue 1/2 mile to blue mailbox # 218 on right. **Studio is open year round- call ahead.**
